**A BYLAW OF THE RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF BLUCHER,  
NO. 343 TO PRESCRIBE THE MINIMUM DISTANCE FROM  
MUNICIPAL ROADS THAT BUILDINGS MAY BE SITUATED.**

Pursuant to Section 206 of the Rural Municipality Act, 1989, the Council of the Rural Municipality of Blucher, #343, in the Province of Saskatchewan hereby enacts as follows:

1. For the purpose of this bylaw the expression:
  - a) "Council" means the Council of the Rural Municipality of Blucher, No. 343;
  - b) "municipality" means the Rural Municipality of Blucher, No. 343 of Saskatchewan;
  - c) "road" means any road allowance within the municipality other than:
    - a) a private road; or
    - ii) a provincial highway; or
    - iii) a road or highway within the Hamlet of Blucher.
1. No person shall hereafter situate any building:
  - a) within 45.72 meters (one hundred and fifty feet) from the center line of any road, except as follows:
    - b) in those instances where a building has been in existence prior to 1975, and this said non-conforming building is situated within the stated setback, any new building may, upon approval by resolution of the Council, have a reduced setback up to a distance equal to the set back of the said existing pre 1975 non-conforming building;
  - c) within 90 meters (three hundred feet) from the intersection of two or more roads.
1. Any person who contravenes the provisions of section 2 hereof is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to the penalties imposed in the general bylaw of the municipality.
2. Bylaw 6-2001 is hereby repealed.
