

## REEVES REPORT. APRIL 2023

First thing I must do is apologize for the long time between Reeve reports. I will try to be more timely with these reports. Thanks for your patience.

I am going to start this report by touching on a few long standing issues that council has been dealing with. First, the issue we refer to as the Clavet loop. Since the twinning of Hwy 16 we have been negotiating with the Ministry of Highways and Infrastructure (MHI) to come up with a feasible plan for the land between old 16, and the now decommissioned service road. I am pleased to report that reasonable valuation of this land has finally occurred and the ratepayers and businesses along that area now have an opportunity to buy this land. One business has already done so. Councillor Appelt, former councillor Fonstad and the administration have put considerable time and effort into dealing with this long drawn out affair. We are all relieved that these efforts have been rewarded.

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Lets talk about some of the items that have been on our Pest Control Officers plate. It is strongly believed that a cougar recently killed a horse in our south boundary road area. Livestock owners in the area have been notified, so be on the look out and contact the RM if you sight a cougar. Wild boars have also been reported in the RM. So notify us if you see one of those as well. We are working on the bull thistle problem as well. We believe the worms that eat the bull thistle flowers are prevalent in the infested areas. Our plan is to see if these insects
